As a kid, I loved to run around with my cousins in my grandma's backyard, while all the grown-ups in our family would sit and chat together on the deck. Her yard was such a fun place to be, and my grandma was one of my favorite people in the world. She was incredibly loving, giving, and kind. One time, I got a huge splinter in my foot running up the wooden stairs onto the deck. Immediately, I started crying, not sure if anything could make it better. But then I said to my grandma, "I need some cookies!" And as she often did, she brought out some cookies. But it wasn't really cookies that would make me better. My grandma picked me up and set me in her lap, which was one of the safest places in the world. I didn't just need cookies. I needed something much bigger: my grandma's love! (And my dad was super helpful getting the splinter out, too!)

Sometimes we ask for small things, when we really need something much better and bigger. In the Bible story today, a man who is not able to walk asks Peter and John--two of Jesus' followers--for money. He needed money like I needed cookies. It might have helped a little, but really this man really needed something bigger. He wanted a miracle--to be able to walk! And God gave it to him; it really was a miracle! This story encourages me to remember that we should ask God for big things--the things we really want! And just like my loving grandma, God is faithful to give us what we need.

Activity
